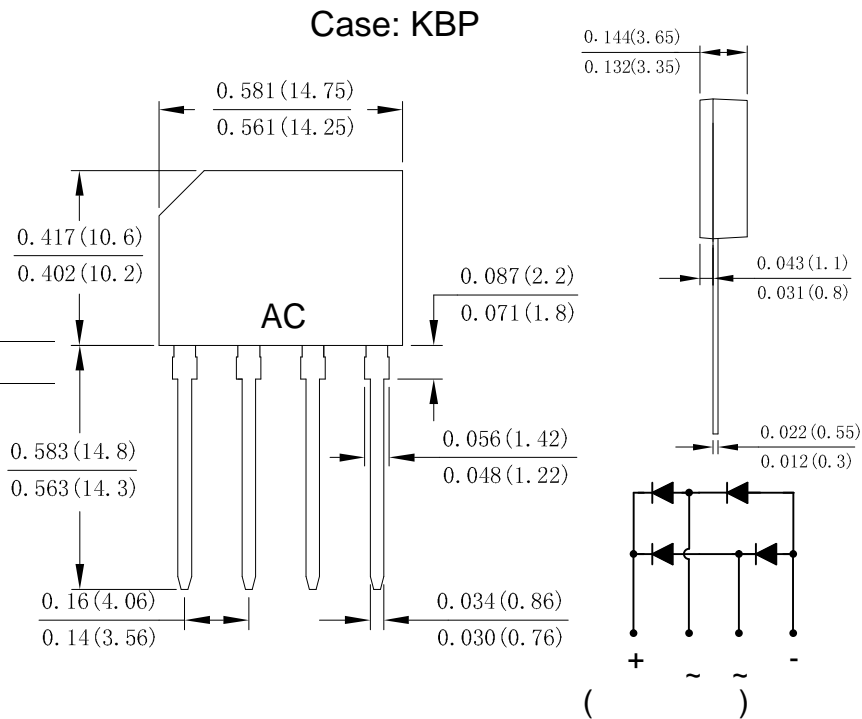

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Fig. 1 Forward Current Derating Curve

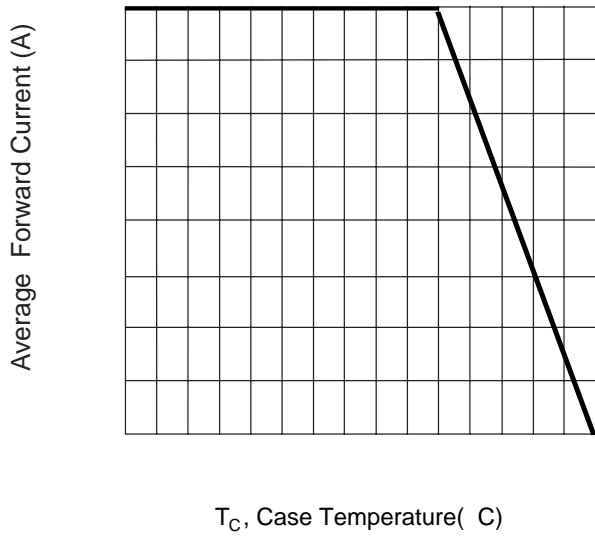


Fig. 2 Typ. Forward Characteristics

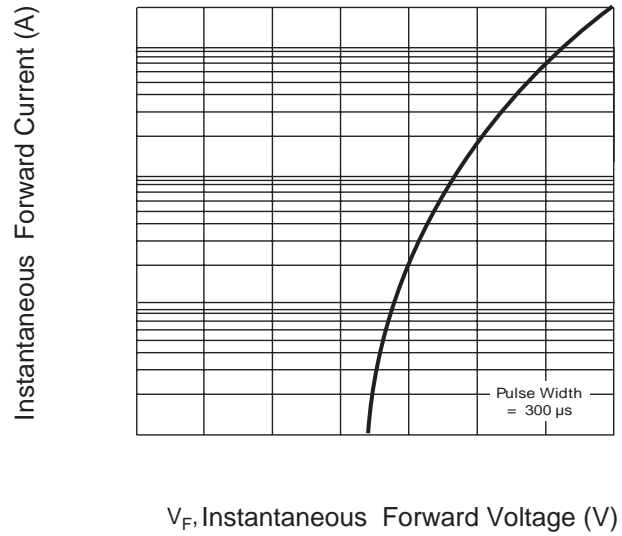


Fig.3 Maximum Peak Forward Surge Current

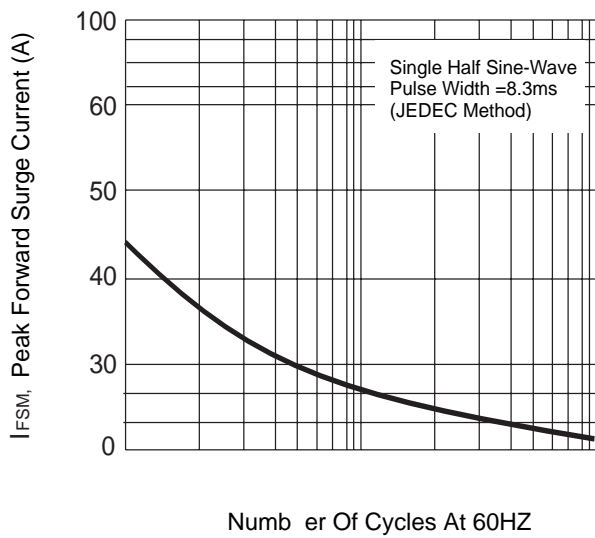


Fig. 4 Typical Reverse Characteristics

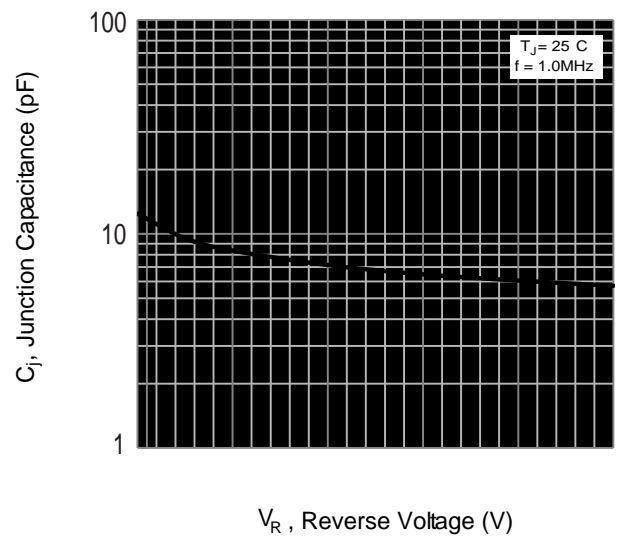
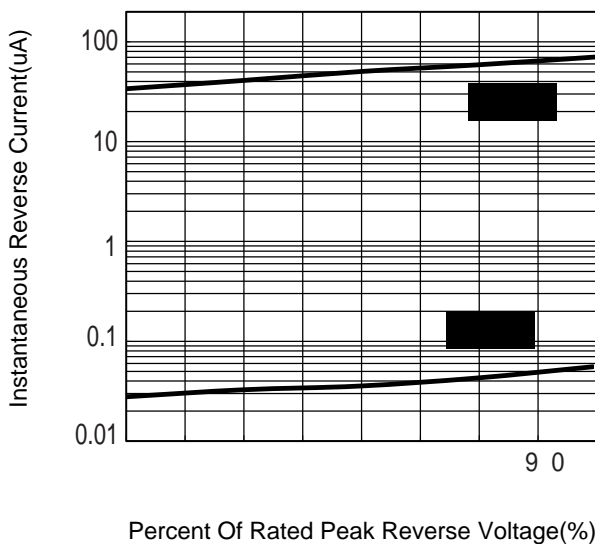


Fig.5 Typical Reverse Characteristics





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
